- a. HMP- No new updates.
- b. RCP- Meeting being set for 1:30 February 10, 2026.
- c. CDBG-MIT- Project development, invoices have been received, hydrology studies revealed bigger issues than expected, and all projects going over budget. Bald knob-other than going over budget, they don't see an issue with getting it done. CR274 after elevated and bigger culverts its still going to go over top by eight feet, to move it up to a 5-year event would be roughly \$7.5 million and a 10 year would be 10.5 million. The Copperas Cove and Gatesville projects are over running as well.
- d. FEMA RPA-DR 4781- 11 project worksheets have been submitted for reimbursement and two more invoices are pending approval-one is for \$217,000 and the other is \$164,000. Road & Bridge is starting to compile estimates for the last 13 sites.
- e. LCFP- All of the small gauges have been placed along the watershed and NRS has been meeting with TXDOT to get the large gauges placed.
