The Coryell County Commissioners' Court convened at 9:05 a.m. with all members present. County Judge, Roger Miller gave the invocation and led the Pledge to the American and Texas Flags.

  - a. The Court accepted the December 2025 Financial Summary report from the County Treasurer.
  - b. The Court accepted the January 2026 Financial Summary report from the County Judge's Office.
  - c. The Court accepted the January 2026 Financial Summary report from the County Auditor.
  - d. The Court accepted the minutes for the Historical Commission meeting held on January 14, 2026.
  - e. The Court accepted Constable John Burks Texas Commission on Law Enforcement license.
  - f. The Court approved the minutes for the Commissioners' Court meeting held on February 10, 2026.

The consent agenda was approved after a motion by Commissioner Ryan Basham and a second by Commissioner Keith Taylor.

6. Justin Latham, Road and Bridge Administrator, gave the report and filed for the record CCRB 2024-02 Paving Oil Contract Extension Agreement, CCRB 2024-03 Aggregate Contract Services Extension Agreement and CCRB 2024-05 Inspection Services Contract Extension Agreement.

7. The Court approved the replat of West Moody Farms after a motion by Commissioner Ryan Basham and a second by Commissioner Kyle Matthews.

8. The Court accepted The Ranches at Buena Vista acknowledgment to vacate plat after a motion by Commissioner Kyle Matthews and a second by Commissioner Ryan Basham.

9. An update was provided regarding IT services.

10. Updates on grants were given:

- a. HMP- No new updates.
- b. RCP- A workshop was held and the County is still on track.
- c. CDBG-MIT- A presentation was given by Walker Partners. The Court removed CR 274 low water crossing from the CDBG-MIT grant from Commissioner Scott Weddle and a second by Commissioner Kyle Matthews.
- d. FEMA RPA-DR 4781- Two more projects sitting with FEMA, one is a bridge, and the other is a low water crossing.
- e. LCFP- Micro sensors have been placed throughout the County.

11. The Court accepted the 2025 Racial Profiling Report from Constable Burks, Pct. 4 after a motion by Commissioner Kyle Matthews and a second by Commissioner Ryan Basham.

The Court approved the agreements with local fire departments to include a checklist that references section 5, the departments are required to stay in compliance with Federal, State, and local ordinance regulations after a motion by Commissioner Kyle Matthews and a second by Commissioner Keith Taylor. 13. The Court approved Court Order 26-02, Order Prohibiting and Restricting the Placement and Display of signs on County Owned Properties after a motion by Commissioner Kyle Matthews and a second by Commissioner Ryan Basham. (Attached)

14. The Court enacted a burn ban with Court Order CC26-01, Order Prohibiting and Restricting Outdoor Burning, after a motion by Commissioner Kyle Matthews and a second by Commissioner Keith Taylor. (Attached)


**Closed Meeting/Executive Session**

The Court reconvened into open meeting at 1:18 p.m.


